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School uniform

We do appreciate that one of the challenges we have all faced this year has been purchasing new school shoes and new school uniform. In addition, as children can no longer change in school, there are a number of days each week when children need to come to school in PE kits. However, there are a growing number of children who are wearing variations to the school uniform that are unacceptable. The key issues are:

- children should not be wearing neck scarves during the day that double as face coverings. Like all other face coverings they should be kept in a small bag in children's trays or school bags,
- hair accessories that are very large and more suitable for weekend wear (things like this do become distracting in school) and
- colourful or flimsy footwear – preferably children should wear black school shoes or trainers.
