Welcome to Miss Hayes!

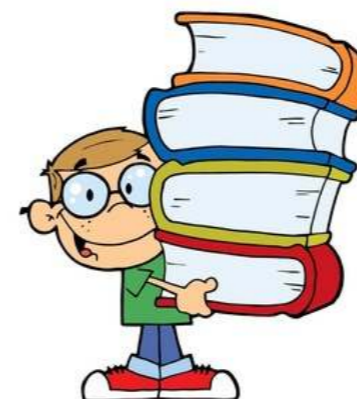

On Thursday 3rd March children can come to school dressed as their favourite book character. They should bring their completed book challenges by Friday 26th February.

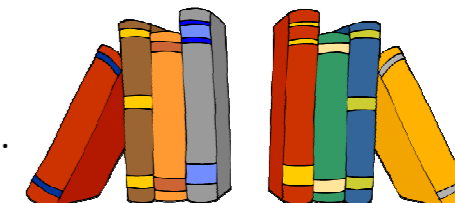

Louis made the most of one wet playtime and used an Ipad to create a simple animation. The slides below give you a flavour of what this is like. Well done Louis.



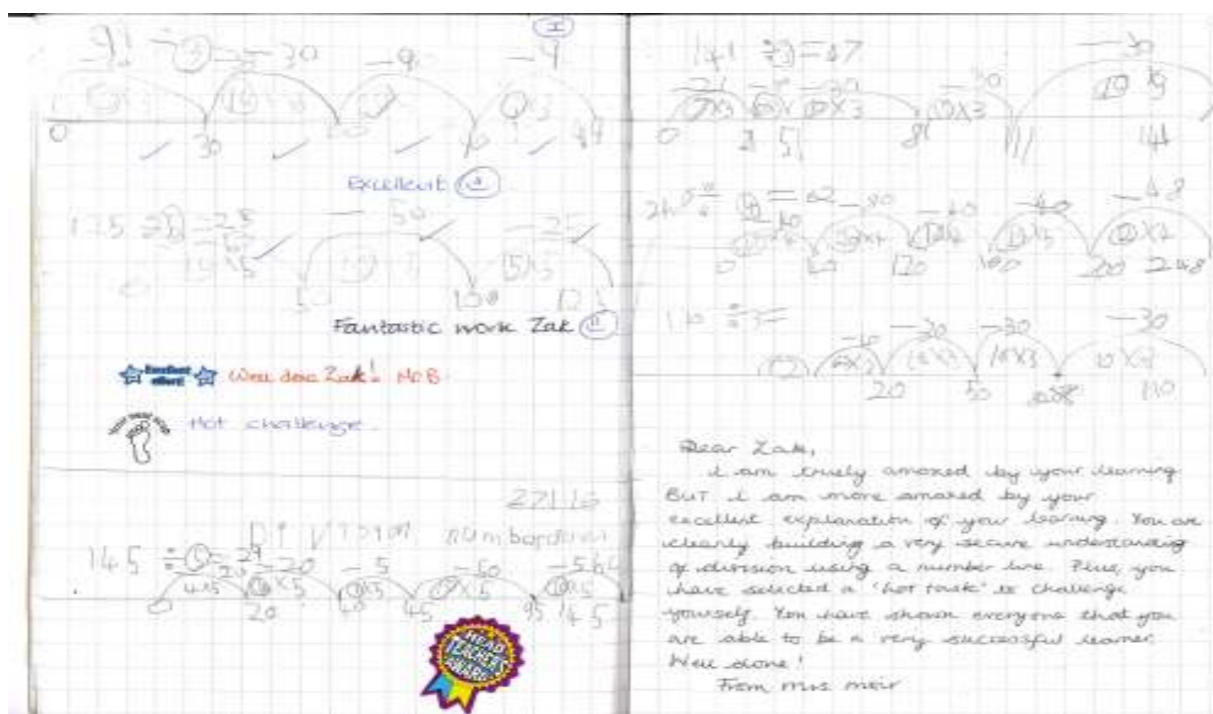
