Opportunities for English (AfL links): In English we are using the book Avery Everywhere: A day in Ancient Egypt to give us more insight in our topic but to also learn the art of a great non-chronological report. There is always grammar to be learnt to support our learning and lots of new spelling rules to pick up along the way.		Opportunities for mathematics (AfL links): For maths, children will be recapping and extending their knowledge of place value to ensure they are secure before adding in rounding, negative numbers. Then we will be launching into addition and subtraction. All the while it is important we identify any gaps in prior knowledge before adding new learning.
